Alice Hendy MBE lost her brother Josh to suicide at 21 years old. Josh had been researching over the internet techniques to take his own life.

To ensure more help and support is given to individuals searching for harmful content online, Alice set up Ripple Suicide Prevention.

#1 cause

of death for young people aged between 5 and 34 in England and Wales in 2019 was suicide. (ONS)

>26%

of suicide cases in under 20s and 13% of those in 20–24-year-olds had a suicide-related search history. (The Lancet & University of Manchester)

7%

of UK children attempt suicide by the time they reach 17 years old. (Centre for Longitudinal Studies)

Nearly 50%

of 17–19-year-olds with a diagnosable mental health disorder has self-harmed or attempted suicide at some point. (NHS)

Universities

Parents urge UK universities to reveal student suicide rates

- the Department for Education is engaging experts and those with lived experience to review relationships, sex and health education guidance to determine whether suicide and self-harm prevention will be included as an explicit part of the curriculum to support young people

Universities urged to do more to prevent student suicide

'Universities can help save lives when they adopt a proactive response to suicide prevention,' sector leader says

- we are investing £2.3 billion extra a year into mental health services, and have set out our aim in the [NHS Long Term Plan](#) for an additional 345,000 children and young people to access NHS-funded mental health support by 2024

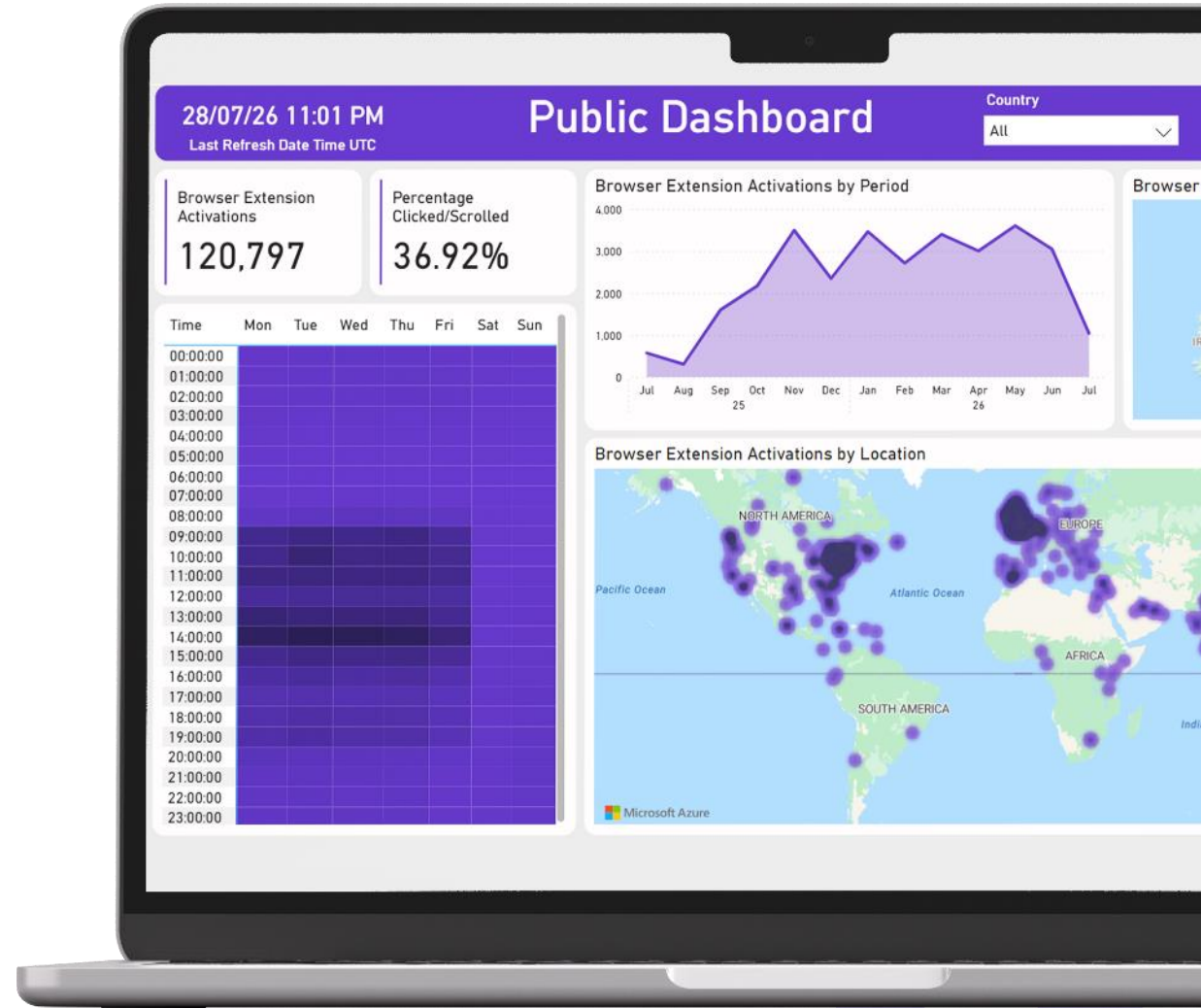

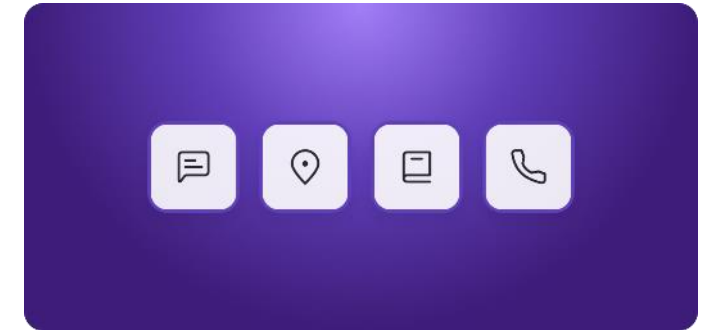
Intercepts the search with a calmly presented pop-up screen.

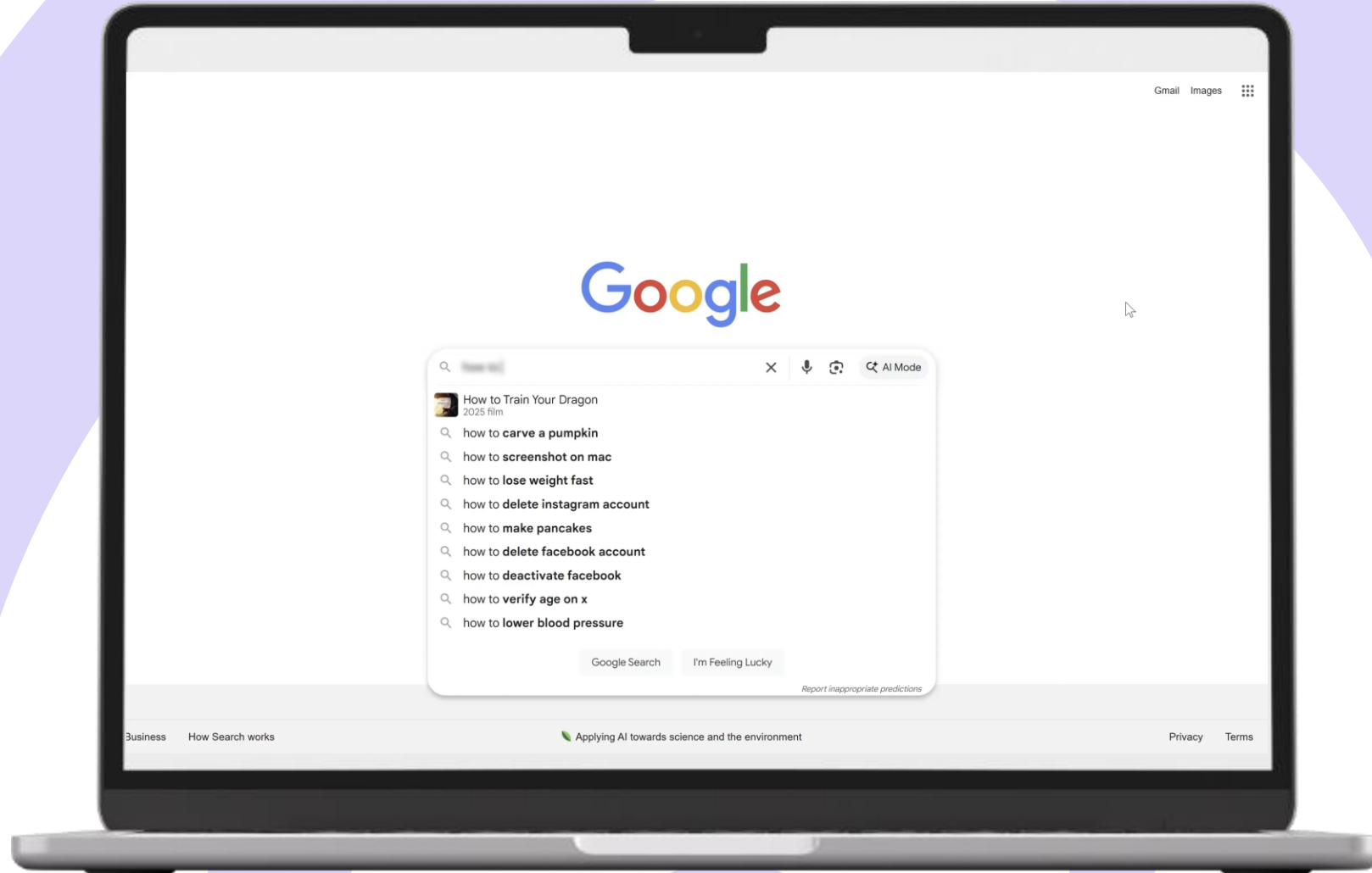
Guides the person through a filter of breathing exercises to help them pause and reflect.

Age-specific crisis intervention

Students face unique mental health challenges at different ages.

By deploying Ripple BrowserShield at your school, college, or university, you can direct students to tailored mental health support for:

- Primary education (ages 5-11)
- Secondary education (ages 11-16)
- Further and higher education (ages 16+)

Expanded protection

Support through mental health challenges and life's struggles

Substance misuse

People with substance abuse are up to 14 times more likely to die by suicide.
(Wilcox HC, Conner KR, Caine ED, et al)

Gambling addiction

Problem gamblers are 15 times more likely to die by suicide.
(Lund University, 2019)

Child sexual abuse

People who were sexually abused as a child are 3 times more likely to try to take their own lives. (Psychological Medicine, 2018)

LGBTQIA+ struggles

LGBTQ+ young people are more than 4 times as likely to attempt suicide than their peers. (Johns et al., 2019; Johns et al., 2020)

Eating disorders

Approximately 9% of people with eating disorders have serious thoughts of attempting suicide.
(Borges G, et al., 2010)

Financial struggles

People with problem debt are 3 times more likely to have had recent suicidal thoughts. (Money & Mental Health)

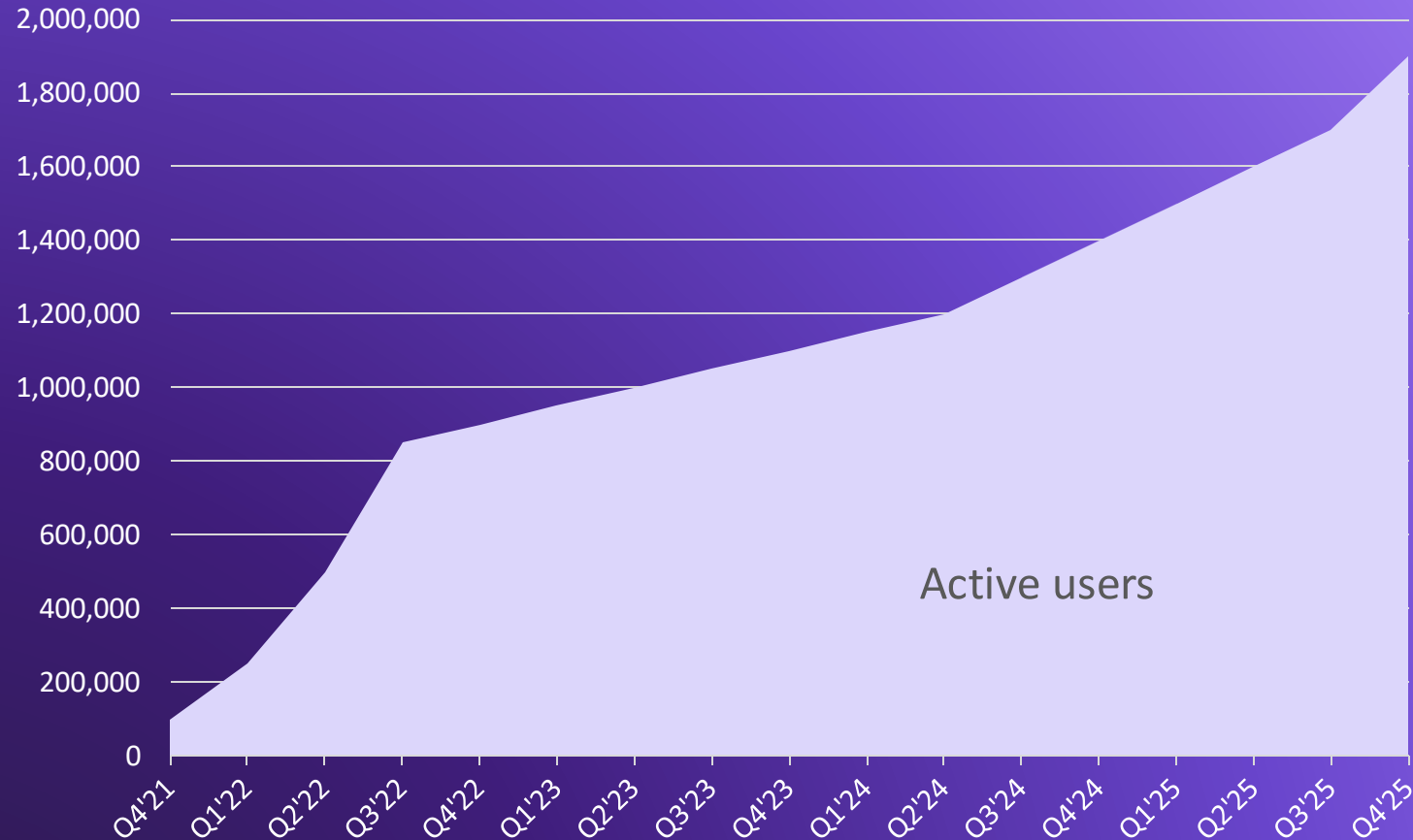

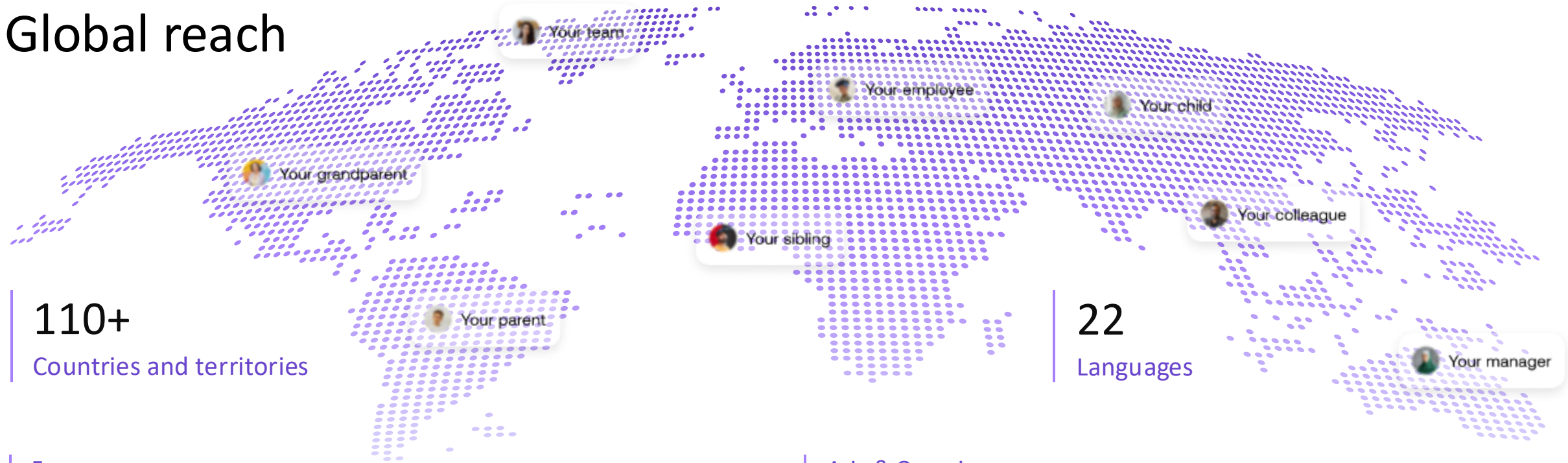
